I have recently had a number of parents and children approach members of staff and myself to complain about the way adults have come onto the school grounds to confront them.

It is very disappointing that a small number of adults are not modelling the types of behaviours that show respect at CTS.

Please leave the follow up and consequences for student behaviour to the school to manage. It is not your right to confront a child and it is certainly not appropriate to belittle or intimidate them. Regrettably this has not been an isolated incident. I am sure that you would not wish for this to happen to your child; so please ensure that you speak to the teacher, dean or member of the senior leadership team should you have a concern.

Our focus at CTS is on restorative practice which enables respectful reintegration in to the school and class setting. This approach maintains respect, enables appropriate consequences and swift reintegration into the learning environment.

On a much more positive note a huge congratulations go to our kids for kids performers. The Year 5/6 students performed and represented themselves and us exceedingly well. Thank you to all of the helpers and organisers, including Mrs Normanton who was a driving force behind this initiative. An excellent event and a very worthy cause.

Finally, I would like to wish our NCEA students the best of luck for their exams. Study hard during your time away and give each exam your best effort. Please ensure you arrive at school in uniform and early to the exam sessions.
