SCIENCE NEWS

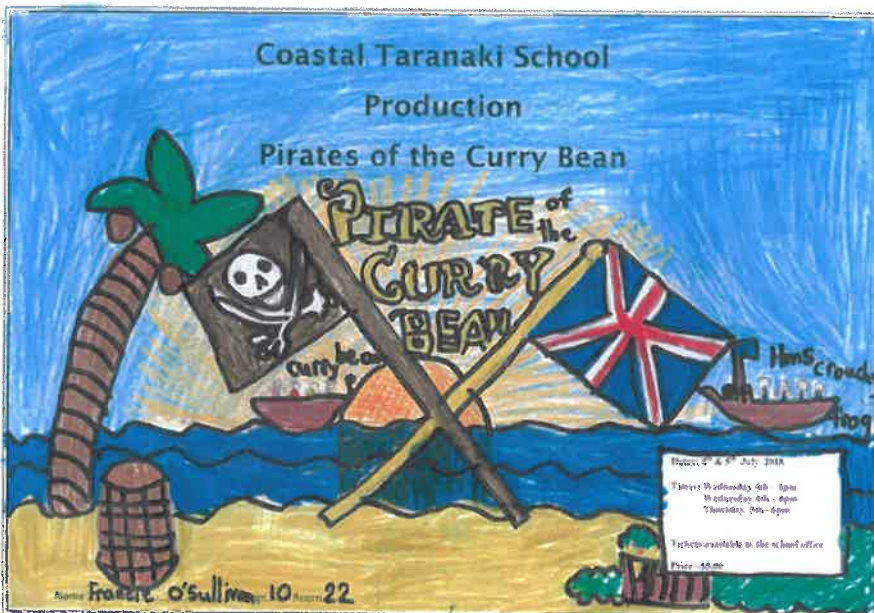
Our Year 7-10 Students are all participating in the upcoming Science Fair.
