Tēnā koutou katoa te whānau o Coastal Taranaki School.

Thank you to the families who made use of the 3-way conferences last week for our senior students. As the year is moving quickly there is a real sense that things are getting serious now in relation to student's achievement in NCEA.

I am pleased to share that our attendance data improved significantly last term. Our new target is to shift from an attendance rate of 89% to 91% or better in Term 3. A weekly trophy of significance to our school's history is awarded to the class with the best attendance rate. Further incentives will be used along with other resources to support the improvement of student attendance.

Our curriculum focus this term Kaitiakitanga or 'Guardianship' has seen a variety of conservation work happening in various contexts for learning. Our mentoring groups have been looking at the health of the Hangaatua River with Matua Jason Ruakere, while another group have been building traps with the New Horizons team. Junior classes have been setting and trapping pests and rodents to protect native flora and fauna. We are grateful for the support of Dr Emily Roberts from DOC.

Our Sport dates for Term 3 shared via facebook recently are also available on our school website. Coming up soon is our school cross-country to be held on 21st August.

Whaea Aria Broughton is teaching Te Reo Māori across our Junior School, ensuring our people know the karakia, waiata and cultural practices of our school. She is supporting a group of senior students who are taking NCEA level Reo Māori.

Due to Mycoplasma Bovis our school will not be holding its traditional 'Lamb and Calf Day' in 2018. In its place we will have a Pets Day in October with the theme **Wool, Wings, Whiskers, Water & Weird**. There will be stalls, displays, prizes and yummy food available. Further information will be shared in the coming weeks.

A friendly reminder that our school will be closing for a **Teachers Only Day on Wednesday the 15th of August**. All members of our staff will be involved in school-wide development. We acknowledge and appreciate the challenge our school closure has on our families and thank you for your support.

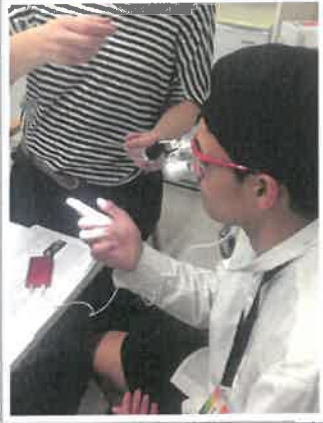
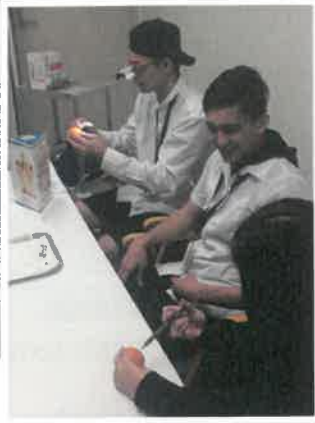
SCHOOL NEWS

The LEAD Big Aroha Conference 2018 was held last Friday the 3rd of August. The leadership conference is a partnership between the Education and Business sectors. The aim is to encourage young people to aspire to leadership. Ten year 5-8 students were invited to attend the event at the CityWest Church in New Plymouth, students from Coastal Taranaki School joined a group of 650 children from across our Taranaki Schools,

This years theme was 'Big Aroha' and we were entertained by the singer/song writers, The Slacks.

The event supports our desire to grow young Coastal Leaders and we will continue to seize these opportunities and make them a regular fixture on our school calendar. Our aspiring leaders represented our school and its community proudly.





Year 11 Students spent Wednesday 1st of August involved in the Whyora Programme at Taranaki Base Hospital.

These sessions aim to expose our students to at least 30 different career options and pathways over two years. As a Year 13 the students who aspire to a more specific career in health will be peered with a mentor in their chosen field.

One visit is spent with guest speakers and the alternate visit is spent touring different parts of the hospital.

Our most recent visit began with Dr Andrea who is a dental surgeon. She discussed a variety of roles within her sector and allowed the students time to use some of the tools for the job.



We visited Michaela who is a Physio in the hospital Gymnasium who spoke initially about Physiotherapy as a career option and demonstrated aspects of treating patients.

Finally Stuart Young from Fulford Radiology who trains up and coming Radiographers. After having a look at a variety of X-Ray films Stuart further showed us examples and the difference between MRI, Ultrasound and CT scans. He is happy for students to contact him to arrange visits if they are interested.

LEARNZ planned a Virtual Field Trip from Tuesday the 31st of August through until Thursday 2nd of August. The kaupapa or main learning focus was related to Mapping and GIS tools with a focus on the Taranaki Mounga Project. This aligned perfectly with the work some of our students have been undertaking with Matua Jason Ruakere (Core Education/Puniho Pā) through their coding programme.

- Day 1 - Was initially based at Puniho Pā, story of the maunga, awa monitoring and hīkoi along the Puniho track, gathering map data with Tiki Toa students from Coastal Taranaki School.
- Day 2 - based at North Egmont, bird relocations, finding and monitoring whio and how to use iNaturalist app to collect information.
- Day 3 - Future vision and aspirations, based at Rotokare Scenic Reserve, focus on Kiwi and trapping techniques, maths and mapping.

Everyday began with a live web conference at 9.15 each to allow tamariki time to interact with some of our experts. The days concluded with the team making a video to demonstrate how to create a story map so other students can do this in the classroom. The team has also uploaded new videos of interviews with various people during the field trip to share with other schools and students. Protecting native birds with Coastal Taranaki School



Year 5 and 6 students from Coastal Taranaki School have been on three fabulous field trips to Komene 13B Māori Reservation, Pukeiti Rainforest and Rotokare Scenic Reserve as part of their inquiry focussing on native birds. With their newly gained ornithological knowledge, this term their focus will be on protecting bush areas around

Ōkato, providing safe habitat for local birds through predator control. They have completed a whole heap of additional learning around the field trips and we think that this is a shining example of the type of project that can be undertaken as part of Towards a Predator-Free Taranaki.
