### POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING PB4L

We promote positive behaviour for learning here at Coastal Taranaki School. We do this by teaching our students the appropriate behaviours through our school values. Students in Years 1-8, whose behaviour portrays these values, collect vouchers or stamps on coffee cards, once they have 15 or 12 respectively they have earned an ice cream. School values and School Council members serve these ice creams every Tuesday lunchtime. Students in years 8-13 collect stamps on coffee cards and get entered into a weekly draw for a \$10 City Centre voucher.

Most students at CTS follow the expectations we have instilled, but there are always students whose behaviour is not aligned with our values. Their behaviour is recorded onto our school management system called Hero. We are delighted that the number of entries on our system has greatly reduced over Term 2 2020.

Parents/Carers of children whose behaviour is a major cause for concern, are normally called by the class teacher, the team leader, the SENCO or a member of the Leadership team. We have also decided that once a student has had 4 minor entries over a term their parents/carers will also be contacted to ensure transparency. 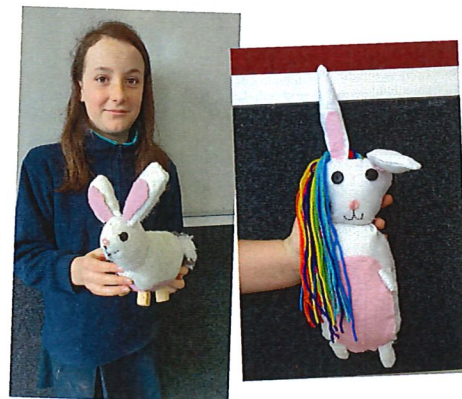

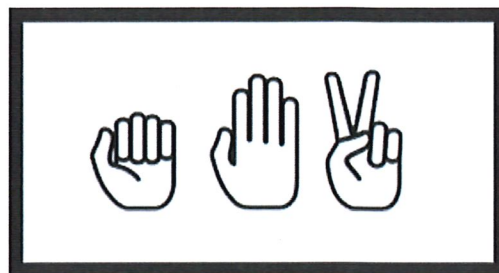
Congratulations to Caleb Lee-Devine who during Lockdown won a colouring competition - Fanga Dan FDC Motorsport.

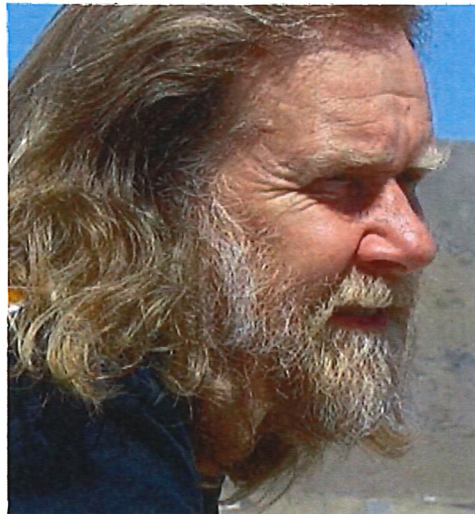
