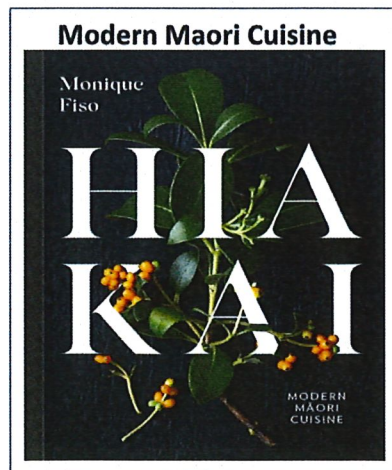
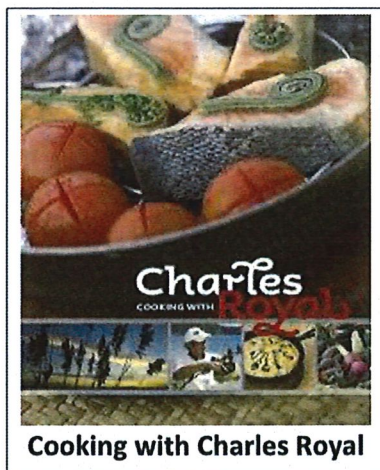


Students are playing the Te Reo Māori version of twister - Āwhiowhio. The game was made by a group of intermediate students.

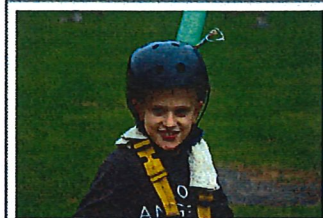
Legs to car
